Guest Lecture was organized on the occasion of World Organ Donation Day by Padmabhushan Dr. Vasantravdada Patil College, Tasgaon and Government Rural Hospital, Tasgaon

Guest Speaker: Dr. Smt. A.S. Bonde,

August 13 of every year is observed as World Organ Donation Day aimed at raising awareness about the importance of organ donation and encourages people to take a pledge for the same.

Organ donation can give a person a new lease on life. However, according to available statistics, the rate of organ donation is 35 per million people in Spain, 27 in England, and 0.16 in India. August 6 is celebrated as Organ Donation Day in India.

Social service activities are always carried out on behalf of National Service Scheme. What is organ donation? Speaker explained to the college students on the occasion of “13th August Organ Donation Day” This should be known, as well as awareness about organ donation. What is Organ Donation under the Organ Donation Campaign? Government Rural Hospital, Tasgaon, and National Service

Scheme jointly discussed the issue on Friday. The lecture was organized in the college on 13/8/2016.

Health Officer of Government Rural Hospital, Tasgaon. Dr. A. S. Bonde was invited to give a lecture on this subject. The introductory speech of this program was made by Shri. P. R. Jadhav,

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Smt. A.S. Bonde said that even though the law on organ donation was enacted in 1994, even after 20 years, there is not much information in the minds of the people about its provisions. That is why we have a low rate of organ donation. According to available statistics, the rate of organ donation in different countries is 35 per million people in Spain, 27 in England, 26 in the United States, and 14 in Canada, while in India it is only 0.16. Chennai also has the highest number of organ donation cases in India so far.

After the enactment of the Organ Donation Act, some non-governmental organizations like Zonal Transplant Coordination Center, Mohan Foundation, Shatayu were set up to do this work. Among the Mumbai branches of these institutes, there are about 32 major hospitals in Mumbai. With the help of these hospitals, the waiting list and organ donors are coordinated with the above organizations. Interested organ donors can fill up the organ donation form by visiting the websites of these organizations. But even if the donor wishes, it is up to the next of kin to carry it out after his death. Organ donation is almost impossible without this relative or family member informing the organization. That is why the organ donation application needs the signature of a witness along with his close relatives.

Upon completion of the organ donation application, the organ donor receives an organ donor card from the organization, which he is expected to carry around as long as he has a driver's license. Even if a close relative has no idea whether a person died before filling out the form and whether the deceased wanted to donate

the organs, the doctor said that the organs of the deceased are eligible for donation, but with the written consent of a close relative of the deceased.

There are also many misconceptions about organ donation. The biggest misconception is that organizations working in this field may be black-marketing or arbitrarily manipulating the organs. So often the relatives of the deceased are seen ignoring the wishes of the deceased by avoiding donating the organs of their loved ones. However, it is important to note that organizations working in this field operate by international guidelines under organ donation law.

Another problem with organ donation is that the number of premature deaths due to heart, pancreas, and liver failure is very high. But no living person can give a heart to another. Parts of a living person's pancreas and liver can be implanted in the body of the needy, but there can be a danger. So if these organs of a dead person become available, it can be more beneficial anytime. Alternatively, these organs can only be used by a person who has been placed on a ventilator and other life support system in the hospital and is brain dead. A person is declared 'brain dead' if the blood supply to the brain is cut off due to an irreparable defect in the blood vessel that supplies blood to the brain but the heart is working. In such a case, the person's upper limbs are working properly and they can be useful for charity. Also, since the death took place in a hospital, if the doctor informs the relatives of the deceased in time, it will be possible to take a share in the number of organ donations. Because one organ donor can provide resuscitation to about ten needy people. And this resuscitation is the main link to reach the needy relative of the deceased. Apart from this, eye and skin donation can also be done for a person who has died due to any other reason. Body donation can also be done. Of course, there is no denying that it will be difficult for the doctors to get the story down to the relatives of the deceased at that moment. This may be since there is a lot of desecration of corpses, blackmailing of removed organs, what people will say, not

to spend money on the next handover, etc. There is also a misconception that if someone has vitiligo, their skin cannot be used. But before using any organ, it is used only by sterilizing it properly.

The program was presided over by Dr. B.T Kanse, Dr. Tatoba Badame organized the program, while Shri. A.R. Patil gave the vote of thanks.
